Have a lovely weekend.





**Headlice** Unfortunately we seem to be suffering from repeated outbreaks of head lice throughout the school.

Lots of children get head lice, regardless of whether their hair is clean or dirty but dealing with this problem is only effective if everyone follows the routine for checking and treating an outbreak.


- The most important symptom is of course itching. This is caused by an allergic reaction to the saliva from the louse when it bites you. It feels like something is moving through your hair, which might tickle a bit.
- Red spots on the scalp. These are caused by lice bites, so look for these as well.
- Sores on your head which are caused by scratching

Wet combing involves removing head lice with a special fine-toothed comb. It's suitable for everyone and is relatively inexpensive.

A number of lice removal combs are available to buy. Combs with flat-faced teeth spaced 0.2-0.3mm apart are best for removing head lice, although combs with smaller gaps can be used to remove eggs and nits (egg cases).

A commonly used method is described below.

- Wash the hair with ordinary shampoo and apply plenty of conditioner.
- Use an ordinary, wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair.
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the louse detection comb.
- Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots, with the edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp.
- Draw the comb down from the roots to the ends of the hair with every stroke, and check the comb for lice each time – remove lice by wiping the comb with tissue paper or rinsing it.
- Work through the hair, section by section, so that the whole head of hair is combed through.
- Do this at least twice to help ensure you haven't missed any areas, until no more lice are found.



**Starting school** is an important step for your child. Cornwall Council want to make the process of applying for a school place as easy as possible.

**Reception Class** If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014 you will need to apply for a school place for September 2018. **The deadline for applications is 15 January 2018.**

If you submit an application by 15 January 2018 you will be sent a letter in the post on 16 April 2018 telling you which school you have been allocated. If you opted through the online application system to also be notified by email, you will receive this on 16 April 2018.
