

# **Sport Relief 2018**

On Wednesday 18th April, we were lucky enough to have the RNLI come in to talk to us about beach safety and how to react to getting in trouble in the water, changing currents and the different coloured flags.

We thoroughly enjoyed learning about beach safety as well as facts about the RNLI. The Lifeguards showed the children the various warning flags which can be seen on the beach. They also spoke about how to keep safe near the water, showing the children some of the life saving equipment they would use during a rescue. The children thoroughly enjoyed the assembly and were given the opportunity to ask questions at the end. The children learnt about staying safe on the beach plus being careful in the unpredictable waters.

Water craft zone

Do not use inflatables

The red flag represents danger; the red and yellow flag is a safe swimming area (the RNLI advise you not to take your inflatable's and save them for the swimming pool); the orange windsock is to tell you where the wind is blowing and the black and white flag is to indicate the water sports area.
