


YOUTH SPORT TRUST Aspire Celebrates at Youth Sport Conference

Focus on... Maths Mastery

Since September 2016, Shelley Beckerleg, of St Stephen Churchtown Academy, has been training and supporting schools across the Trust to embed a mastery approach to mathematics teaching. Maths Mastery aims to improve pupils' understanding, enjoyment and attainment in maths and is based on research and internationally recognised practice from Singapore and Shanghai. Shelley lives and breathes numbers and has impressive credentials. As well as her 'school job' she also works for Cornwall and West Devon Maths Hub as a Mastery Specialist Teacher and has recently been accredited as a Professional Development Lead by the NCETM. Previous to this, she was an Advanced Skills Teacher for 10 years, seconded to the Cornwall Primary Strategy Team whilst being a Lead Teacher in Cornwall for Maths and English. The ultimate aim is for every child to enjoy and succeed in mathematics, regardless of background and so transform the teaching of maths in the UK.
