Ebola Virus

Advice for parents/guardians

Parents/guardians should not be unduly worried about the possibility of their children catching the Ebola Virus.

- The risk of Ebola arriving in the UK is low and to date there have been no cases of Ebola Virus Disease being contracted in the UK.
- Any person arriving in the UK having travelled from any Ebola affected countries will be screened. If they are free of symptoms they are not infectious so there should be no restrictions on their school attendance or normal activities.
- It is not possible to catch Ebola from a person who is not showing signs of being infected. It can only be caught by direct contact with the blood or body fluids of a person who is ill with the disease.
- There is no reason why your children should not continue to attend school or their early years setting as normal.

What happens on the course?
On this course, you will make your own story sack and find out more about ways story sacks can help to encourage an interest in books and support early reading. You don't have to be artistic or a whizz at sewing – it's achievable for everybody and your tutor will give you loads of help and ideas!

Do I have to attend every week?
Yes please! As far as possible, we'd like everyone to make the commitment to attend.

Do I have to pay?
No! The course is free – but please be prepared to donate some items for your story sack!

Will I have to sit still and do lots of writing like at school?
Not at all! Activities will be informal and fun – that's the best way to learn. And you'll get a cup of tea or coffee!

Ok, it sounds good! I might as well give it a go! What do I do now?
Please sign up at the School Reception or give me, Dawn, a call. Give them your name and a contact number. Unless you hear otherwise, you can assume the course is starting and you are on it! Look forward to seeing you on Weds 12th November!

I've got a younger child at home – what can I do?
We can fund your childcare while you attend the course, as long as your child is with a registered childminder. Give us a call - 01872327519

What sort of activities will we do?
A story sack is a material bag, which contains a children's book and various fun items relating to it. These items aim to capture the child's interest in reading and help the parent bring the book to life!
On the course, you will:

- create items for your story sack, such as puppets and games
- share discussions to find out more about encouraging an interest in books
- learn more about supporting reading with the Family Learning tutor in a relaxed setting
- in the final session, enjoy sharing your story sack with your child
