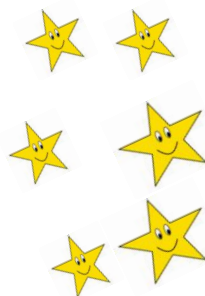

Chicks..... The children at Piccolos have been busy learning about growth and change and care for living things. On a sunny Monday morning just after half term we released our butterflies into the garden after watching them grow from tiny caterpillars to great big caterpillars, then to form chrysalis and hatch into beautiful painted ladies.



Monday we entered the setting to the sound of tiny peeping. Our patient waiting for 21 days in anticipation of hatching chicks paid off. Having been watered daily and kept warm the eggs began to wiggle, a hole and then a beak poked through...



The first and then second of our chicks had hatched. We watched carefully and quietly as others also started. Finally we have 9 to be cared for as we watch them grow over the rest of this term.

Sunscreen As the weather warms up, it is important to remember to apply sun cream to your child on those few and far hot and sunny days. If you wish your child to re-apply sun cream to themselves during the day, please pass it in to their class clearly labelled with your child's name. Staff will then encourage your child to apply the sun screen to themselves as required.





Is your child eligible for Free School Meals? *Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you (or the child themselves in their own right) is in receipt of any of the following benefits.*

- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance.
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance.
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190.
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods

Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)

All Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed above which would entitle your child to free school meals, your school could claim Pupil Premium funding to support your child's education, just by you completing an application form. When you apply we will check your eligibility for free school meals (or Pupil Premium for KS1 pupils) by checking against those held by HM Revenue and Customs, The Home Office and the Department of Work and Pensions.
